Summer Trip to Evesham

In August a small but enthusiastic group travelled to Evesham for the annual summer outing. With rain forecast (but not arriving!) we reversed the day's itinerary and managed to fit everything into a packed day. We had a look at the abbey ruins, and associated churches, which gave a tantalising glimpse of the former grandeur of this monastic foundation.

Of the original abbey, the only undamaged structure remaining (apart from the Almonry) is the 16th century belltower, completed by Abbot Lichfield who was 'advised' to retire or face the consequences. His successor, who speedily handed over the abbey to Henry VIII's officers, was handsomely rewarded for his cooperation. A river trip with a knowledgable guide was the next highlight before visiting the town's almonry museum. This lovely building, worth a visit in its own right, is crammed full of fascinating artefacts, reflecting life through the millennia in the Vale of Evesham.
