Warmington Parish

The principal landowners are Mrs Mary D Freeman, Ed B King Esq, Ven Archdeacon Holbech, Rev WH Harrison, George S Stranks, Wm Judd, Mrs Huggins, Miss Ann Harbage and John Harbage, the former is the lady of the manor. A new graveyard was consecrated in 1869. The church was restored in 1872. Rev AT Morland is curate. Here is a small free school supported by voluntary contributions. Arlescote maintains its own roads. Stoneton consists of one farm in this parish, one mile north-east in the county of Northampton; the house is surrounded by a moat (sic).
